

## School Health Advisory Council Minutes October 20, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 2:10 by Laura Hughes. The members in attendance were:

Laura Hughes welcomed everyone and introduced the new members of the SHAC committee to the existing members. The members of the SHAC 2020 committee are: Shane Strickland, Assistant Superintendent, Kim Nash, Laura Hughes, Ashley Hall, Vicky Trichel, Shelby Willis, Jennifer Siegel and Madison Breighner

Laura Hughes began the meeting by summarizing last year's goals. Even with all the demands Covid has put on the district, the teachers and aides were able to complete the Seizure Awareness Training.

Laura Hughes opened the floor for nominations for 2020-2021 chairman and co-chairman. Vicky Trichel nominated Laura Hughes for chairman, the motion, seconded by Kim Nash, passed unanimously. Laura Hughes nominated Shelby Willis for co-chair, the motion was seconded by Ashley Hall and it passed unanimously.

Before deciding goals for the 2020-2021 school year, members were given a summary of activities that have occurred over the summer and fall. The flu clinic was held on each campus but the attendance was considerably less than previous years. The district has worked diligently to ensure each campus is meeting the regulations set forth by TEA and UIL. They are working with Dr. Steven Welch, the School Based Health Care Physician for Parker County Hospital District. Laura gave a general overview of Covid protocol. Campuses take students' temperature once or twice a day, students and staff are required to wear masks or face shields. The TEA has provided PPE and other supplies to the district. Every campus has an isolation room for students who are showing symptoms. There is an administrative committee that evaluates every covid situation, Shane Strickland heads that committee. The district determines what students should be quarantined by contact tracing. The students who test positive must remain out of school for 10 days; students who are quarantined must remain home for 14 days. The school must also fill out a form and submit it to the Parker County Health

department. The district also has a Victory Electrostatic Sprayer that cleans any room the committee deems necessary.

Laura Hughes also reported that Parker County Hospital District has received a grant that will provide medical pod carts to each campus. The cart will allow the campus nurse to access medical care for students with common illnesses. The parents must fill out paperwork to receive medical care. Not only are supplies and tests available on the cart, Dr. Welch would also be available for a tele-med call. This will be a great alternative for students who might not normally receive care.

Kim Nash reported that the committee needs to complete the Triennial Wellness Assessment. With all the uncertainty Covid has presented, the committee decided to make the assessment the 2020-2021 goal.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:51.
